Introduction:

I want to apply this level of organisation, diversity and event management to my potential role as Central Quad College Officer.

I've loved every second of my time here in TU Dublin and I'm not done yet – a vote for me is a vote for security and progress in these coming months of immense change.

What I plan to do:

The list is incredibly long but I have some major issues that I'll be fighting for below.

1) Lecture Recording

By far one of the biggest failings by academic staff to date is their refusal to record online lecture material. Through their inaction, the student experience has suffered immensely. The refusal to record lecture material has disadvantaged students who are already socioeconomically deprived (poor internet availability, limited laptop access), as well as those who are hard of hearing.

I've passed motions regarding lecture recordings and I've advised students on how to speak with their lecturers individually. With the work of the Union, we've even passed a memo at academic council requesting that all lecturers begin recording them. But this is not enough. Lecturers are still refusing, or changing their mind midway through the semester, or claiming that 'we didn't record them before the pandemic'. But students before the pandemic weren't reliant on their internet being stable at all times to attend a lecture. So vote for me and let me fight for you.

2) Events

There has been an exceptional effort made by the Student's Union this year to create online events for students – from 'I hate Mondays', to campaigns about sexual and mental health awareness. But there will come a time when it's safe to be back on campus; when that happens, we need to see a return of on-site events!

My time as LGBTQ chairperson has helped me understand how to run events, know what events <u>all</u> students enjoy and most importantly, I've done it all before in societies. It's time to make college fun again, not just for a small cohort of students, but for all of us studying here.

3) Grangegorman Facilities

Excited about the elusive move to Grangegorman next semester? Were you aware that there's no proper student centre, no sports centre, no Blackbox theatre, no pool, no proper gym (it's tiny) and we don't even have a completed library yet! We have a temporary library in a campus that's been advertised as being state of the art.

It infuriates me that our students aren't even getting the basic facilities we deserve. I'll work with our Student Union Sabbaticals, lobby for what we as students need and I'll do everything I can to make our college experience something worthwhile. If we need to protest, to fight back, then we will.

Conclusion:

The move is Grangegorman after a global pandemic is going to be challenging – but I'm confident that I can represent us in the move to Central Quad. My extensive experience in both the Student Union and Societies has given me the confidence and determination it takes to represent the best and brightest students that this county has to offer.
